The last MRC in 2014 attracted close to 900 participants, a testimony of participant confidence in the outcome of this conference. This shows that the MRC is a good local platform for and international engineering practitioners and academicians to present their research findings, draft manuals, specifications and guidelines. It is also an excellent venue to share experiences and gain exposure to the latest technologies related to the planning, design, development, construction, management and maintenance of roads and highways.

MALAYSIA ROAD ASSET MANAGEMENT

Road Asset Management is vital when we talk about roads. The effective management of road networks requires budget levels to be sufficient to keep the core road assets in acceptable condition in the long run. With rapid development and the corresponding increase in the number of motorized vehicles, a nation's budget allocation is normally expected to increase in tandem with the increase in road length and axle load of commercial vehicles. In Malaysia, the Public Works Department (PWD) maintains a total of 237,022.353 KM of roads with a limited operating and maintenance budget of RM1,712.00 per kilometre for routine works.

It is always a challenge to maintain existing and new road infrastructure assets with minimum costs. Hence, adequate maintenance funding remains a major concern in the good up-keeping of road assets. In addition, overloading of commercial vehicles, high annual rainfall coupled with the occurrence of flash floods intensify the degradation rates of road structures in Malaysia.

Here, I would like to emphasize that up-to-date information to support management decisions on items such as network inventory details, traffic, axle loads, cost and road condition is imperative. This is becoming increasingly important for us, to be able to predict the effects on the infrastructure that proposed policies are likely to have in the future for the safety, level of service and efficiency of the operation of our road infrastructure. WORLD ROAD CONGRESS

Since the first World Road Congress held in Paris in 1908, the World Road Association or PIARC, has organized Congresses once every four years in a member country.

Malaysia has been invited to bid for the 27th (XXVIIth) World Road Congress 2023 in Yokohama, Japan, from 22nd to 26th October 2018.

The 26th (XXVIth) World Road Congress with the theme "Connecting Cultures- Enabling Economies" will be held in Abu Dhabi, United Arabic Emirates, from 6th to 10th October 2019. The proposed programme includes around 50 sessions, a large exhibition, technical visits and social activities. This will be a unique opportunity for us to present numerous technical results and best practices in all areas related to road infrastructure and road transport.

The Road Engineering Association of Malaysia or REAM, as national organization representing the country's road engineering fraternity, welcomes more technical paper submissions from both the public and private sectors who can meet to present and discuss new approaches and solutions and share their experiences based on the 41 topics identified by the Organizer.

Papers submitted to this congress will be automatically entered in the PIARC Prizes Competition and each qualified paper writer will be entitled to free travel expenses, accommodation and registration fee for the congress. The dateline for the submission of abstracts is on 15th September 2018 and all industry players are advised to submit your papers through REAM.

I am hopeful that all industry players and agencies will support and participate in this congress and be tremendously inspired to take appropriate actions and strategies in your respective countries to ensure better road infrastructure and road transport. Ladies and gentlemen,
